October is our 2nd Annual Coca-Cola® Truck Load FundRaiser! We are offering a case (24 plastic bottles) of 20 ounce carbonated drinks at the price of \$16.00 (\$0.67 per bottle) and noncarbonated drinks (Powerade, Frutopia, lemonades) at the price of \$18.00 (\$0.75) per bottle. These prices are not offered to retailers.

The potential income to WAC is great! At a profit of \$4.50 per case, with a total of 211 swimmers selling an average of 5 cases, the club would earn \$4,747.50! In 2002 we had 207 swimmers with only 40 families participating, that was only 21% of our enrolled families. We would like to see a significant increase in participation this year.

Last year's top seller, Lauren Sheetz has already sold 40 cases in less than 1 week! Let's see if some other teammates can keep up!

Grocery Gift Cards Save You Money and Help the Team!

Grocery gift cards are a good money maker for the club. You buy a gift card for a hundred dollars and you can buy a hundred dollars worth of groceries. You lose nothing

and actually gain because the grocery stores sell us the gift cards at a discount. Per policy, you get 2.5% of the value of the card rebated against dues. The club gets the remainder as extra income. This reduces your swim bill in two ways -- directly by the rebate and indirectly through the extra club income. The club has made over \$2000 through this fund

raiser in the four months of this year. Currently approximately 20% of the members participate in this fundraiser. Imagine our earnings if all members participated. Cards are available from coaches Harold and Jeff. Try one.
